The **U.S. ARMY RESERVE AVIATION COMMAND (ARAC)** based in Ft Knox, KY provides Command and Control for all Army Reserve aviation.

With more than 4,400 Soldiers, 600 Civilians and 230 aircraft in 12 states, the ARAC is one-of-a-kind, providing Command and Control for all Army Reserve aviation, air assault, air movement, aeromedical evacuation, and inter- and intra- theater transportation.

The United States Army Reserve is working toward approval of replacing two hangars at Godman Army Airfield. Construction would bolster local jobs and opportunities. Approval of the first hangar will cost the U.S. government an estimated \$131.2 million as of 15 NOV 23.
