

84th TC Summary and Observations of Trends



84th TC Summary

- >Builds up and tears down 3 CTC-Like and 6 Warfighter-Like multi-echelon exercises with moderate level operational environments each year.
- >Trains more brigades per year than all the Combat Training Centers.
- ➤ Sustains mission accomplishment with ~3,300 part-time Soldiers, 296 full-time Soldiers, 125 full-time civilians, and about 110 contractors.
- ➤ Trains approximately 240 observer coach trainers each year.
- >Trains approximately 100 senior gunners each year.
- > Executes 5 live fire events per year (including 1 for forces in Korea)
- > Conducts the External Evaluation for Combined Forces Headquarters Korea twice a year.

Potential Trends reference Soldiers' thinking about Kentucky

- > We have seen an increase in Soldiers hesitant to come to Kentucky in the last three years. Anecdotally:
- Perception of Schools
- Perception of few amenities and attractions
- Perception of low tolerance
- Perception that KY = rural living with limited cosmopolitan options
- > We have noted an increase in Soldiers and Civilians choosing to live in Southern Indiana due to cost of living
- Increased dispersion of addresses from Radcliff, Elizabethtown, and Meade County (18-20 miles) to Louisville and Bardstown (30-40 miles), Southern Indiana (40-50 miles), Shelbyville (60 miles), etc due to a lack of affordable available housing.
- > Enhanced HWY 44 and other for direct access to Fort Knox without using HWY265 or HWY313 to I65 and beyond.
- Enhanced promotion and advertisement of successful schools, enduring amenities and attractions, acceptance and tolerance,
 and that KY offers the best combination of small town and metropolitan feel.

2 x USAR-Wide Planning Work Groups each year (100+ attendees) 3 x 84th TC General Officer events (6 + General Officers and 50+ supporting attendees) 6-8 Observer Coach Trainer Classes per year (40-60 Students each) 6-8 Senior Gunner Courses each year (20-30 Students each) 2-4 Brigade or Higher HQs exercises per year (100+ personnel each)

Mission Training Center – All Compo Resource

~6-12 40 Pax Classes a Year

~ 5 Brigade HQs (150 pax ea) or higher exercises each year.
NOTE: Available for all components to use for training.
Supports V CORPS training needs.

MTCs *builds and sustains readiness* by providing Unit Commanders an Army approved Decisive Action Training Exercise conduct via computer-based exercises (CBX) to stimulate the Commander's Training Objectives in order to obtain an external evaluation to increase their "T" rating.
